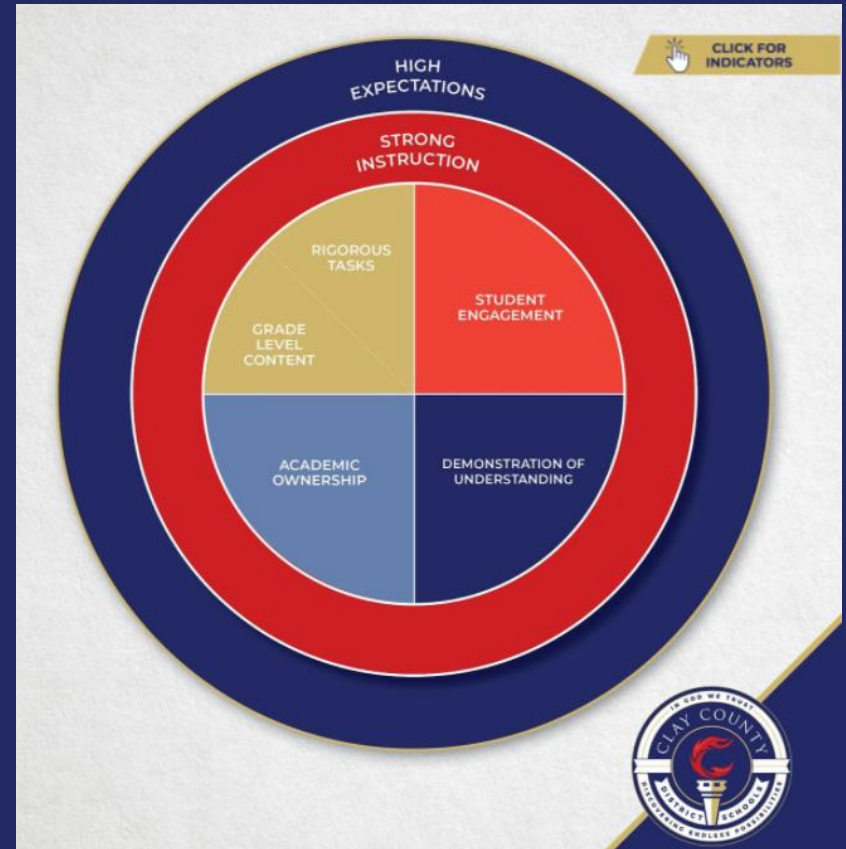

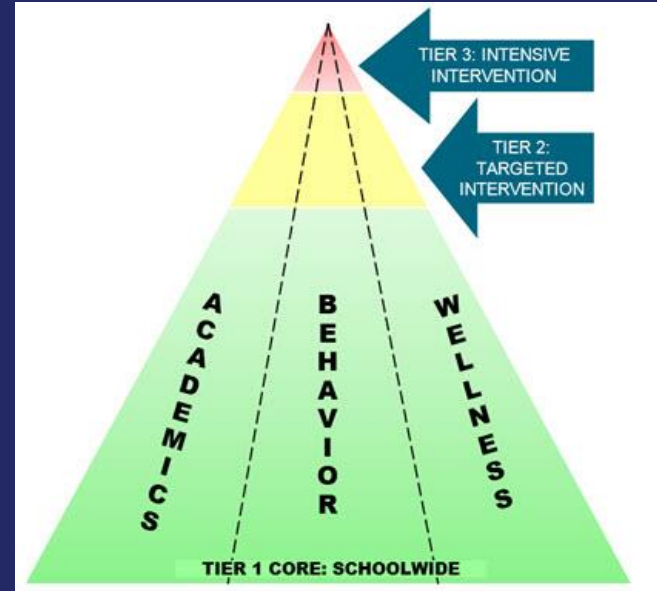
Supporting the Instructional Vision

- Ensuring appropriate academic placement.
- Having a focus on equity so that all students have opportunities for accelerated and specialized programs.
- Removing barriers that impede learning through intentional programming.
- Providing skills for social-emotional competency



“All in for All Students” Program Planning

- At Shadowlawn Elem, the school counselor makes getting into the classroom each month a high priority in order to teach SEL skills and foster connections with students.
- At Green Cove Junior High, the counselors create monthly “Get Set” lessons that are facilitated school-wide by teachers. The lessons are created to highlight 7 Mindsets and SEL Competencies.
- At Ridgeview High, the school counselors teach academic success skills monthly to 9th and 10th graders to increase graduation and post-secondary prospects.

Fleming Island Elementary

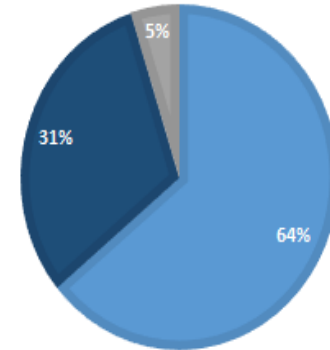
Here are Some Aspects of ROE’s School Counseling Program That I’d Like You to be Aware of:

From **September – January** during the 2020 / 2021 school year...

- 91** Classroom Guidance Lessons took place!
- 72** Lunch Bunch group skill building sessions took place!
- 76** Individual counseling sessions (social emotional & / or academic) took place!
- 6** Student Success Team meetings were held!
- Countless** collaboration sessions between staff and myself (in person, via email, or over the phone) took place on behalf of students and their families.
- 8** 504 plans were updated.
- 4** New 504 plans were developed.
- 43** IEP’s were reviewed for compliance and meetings were carried out.
- 6** ELL plans were developed or updated.
- 7** Students were screened for the ELL program.
- 20** Screening packets were completed for ES services.
- 10** Screening packets were completed for Speech, Visually Impaired, O/T or P/T services.

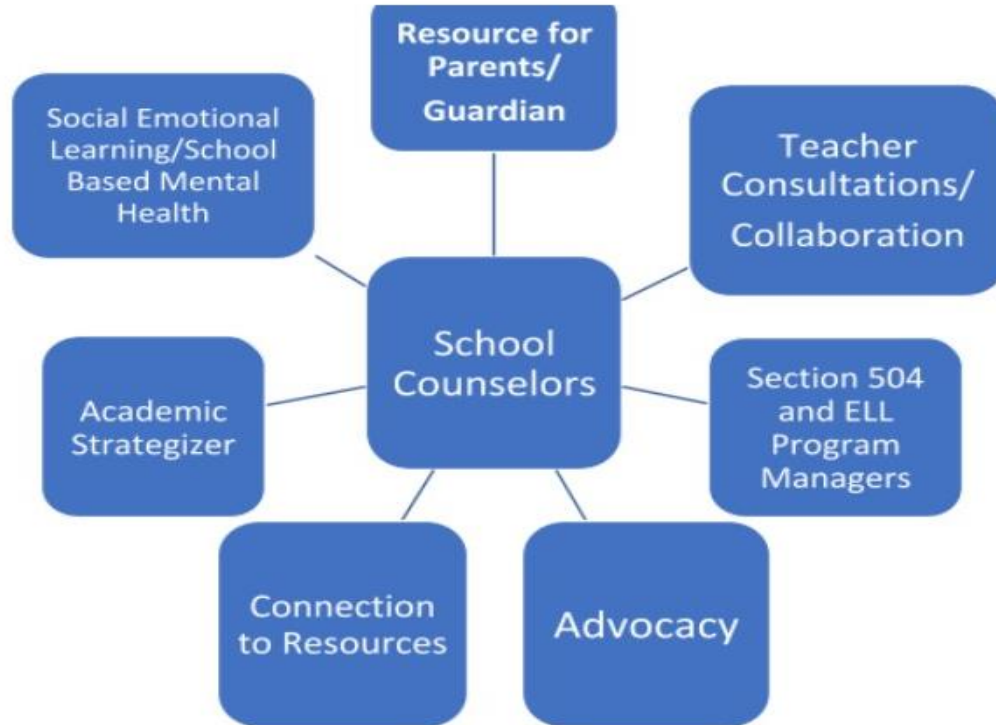
