### <u>Description</u>

The School District of Clay County is required to conduct an Annual Casualty, Safety, Sanitation Inspection Report as well as an Annual Relocatable and Fire Safety Inspection by persons licensed and proficient with applicable Rules and Standards. These Inspection Reports were performed by in-house licensed and qualified personnel and are available for public review.

### **Gap Analysis**

Local fire officials and public school districts must employ or contract with an individual certified as a fire-safety inspector in compliance with Section 633.081, Florida Statutes, in order to conduct a comprehensive fire safety inspection of each public school facility annually. x.1013.12, F.S. and s. 1013.38, F.S. become effective on July 1, 2011.

### **Previous Outcomes**

The SREF/Fire-Safety Inspections was accomplished with two inspectors and completed without disrupting the school for more than a couple of hours. The school custodian is usually available and walks the school with the inspector and takes notes on most deficiencies that are also part of the report. The schools than fix or place work orders for deficiencies found and return a letter stating all items completed or Work Order placed.

### **Expected Outcomes**

The SREF/Fire Safety Inspections will be done with only one inspector and may be a concern with the school testing and volume of work. The schedule will be put out to the schools and the plan is to try and schedule around the testing dates. 




Side by Side comparison

-Neighborhood inclusion: Oakland Hill at Eagle Landing






Side by Side comparison

<u>Title/</u> C28 - School Bus Replacement: Lease/Purchase Agreement to replace 100 school buses to improve service and stakeholder experience.

### **Description**

The agreement between the School Board of Clay County and Matthews Bus Alliance will add 100 new school buses with AC and camera equipped to the fleet.

### **Gap Analysis**

The transportation department has traditionally purchased 20-30 buses per year in the capital plan to replace older buses reaching service limit. As the Board is aware, we have been working to retrofit our newer fleet with AC and cameras. We also discontinued the practice of purchasing buses without AC. At this time we have 240 buses operating and in-service. 103 out of the 240 are older buses and do not have AC. In light of recent heatwaves that produced multiple days of record-breaking triple digit heat indexes, temperatures in buses easily reached 100 to 125 degrees Fahrenheit. The heat is a safety concern for students as well as working conditions for our employees. We had 8 drivers resign as a result of high temperatures this last month. The aging un-air conditioned fleet presents current barriers with our ability to recruit, attract and retain bus drivers, as well as provide a comfortable experience for our students/stakeholders.

### **Previous Outcomes**

The Transportation Department typically purchased 20-25 buses per year via the capital plan at an average of \$2.43M per year.

### **Expected Outcomes**

The 7 year lease/purchase agreement will provide CCDS:

- 100 new buses equipped with AC and camera surveillance at a cost \$1.64M per year.
- Bumper to Bumper 5 year warranty which drastically reduces parts and maintenance cost associated with aging fleet (estimated at \$400,000.00). Matthews Bus Alliance provides a full time on site service representative at our Middleburg bus shop/depot to support our bus shop.
- The district retains the titles for the buses
- Reduction in the required capital outlay of \$788,007.64 annually (Annual from \$2.43M to \$1.64M) that can be repurposed to critical capital projects
- The opportunity to recapture capital dollars by removing/selling 80 school buses from our fleet (estimated at \$800,000.00) which can be immediately used to upgrade older white. The best 20 school buses will be retained and maintained as support for emergency replacements.
- 100% of all CCDS school buses will have AC and also be equipped with cameras.
- Better working condition for current CCDS bus drivers. Increasing the number of new bus driver applicants.

### **Strategic Plan Goal**

Ensure effective management of the organization, operations, and facilities to maximize the use of resources and promote a safe, efficient, and effective learning environment for Clay County students.

### Recommendation

Enter into the lease purchase/agreement to upgrade the fleet by replacing 100 of our older bus that do not have air-condition.
