Discussion on 2016-17 Stance

- January 2016: Presented the School Board with two options:
 - Continue with Current Assessment Structure and Administer 3rd Quarter Assessments and EOY or
 - Suspend all 3rd Quarter Assessments & EOY Non-VAM Tests
- Rationale for Suspended Assessment:
 - Inability to Validate Alignment and Effectiveness
 - The timeline of Assessment Window was Disruptive



<u>The Need for a</u> <u>Progress Monitoring Plan</u>

- 1. Required in State Statute
- 2. Tracks Student Mastery from One Grade Level to Another
- 3. Provides Valuable information for Students, Teachers, and Parents related to Learning
- 4. Allows Teachers to use Analytics that Inform the Instructional Process
- 5. Evaluates Effectiveness of Instruction
- 6. Gives Scrimmage Opportunities for Students to Practice State Assessment Procedures
