- 100 classroom projects
- 3,167 students with additional grade level reading materials
- 15, 833 students with access to LEGO robotics, coding, and other hands-on STEM experiences
 - Provided media specialists with an additional 5 WeDo robots (18-19) for a total of 7 WeDos, in partnership with NEFL STEM2Hub

MOSH Partnership and 21st Century Microfarms

950 students were able to take fieldtrips to MOSH and get hands-on STEM experiences

550 students at **3** different schools explored agriscience career pathways, healthy eating and nutrition, both during and after school.
