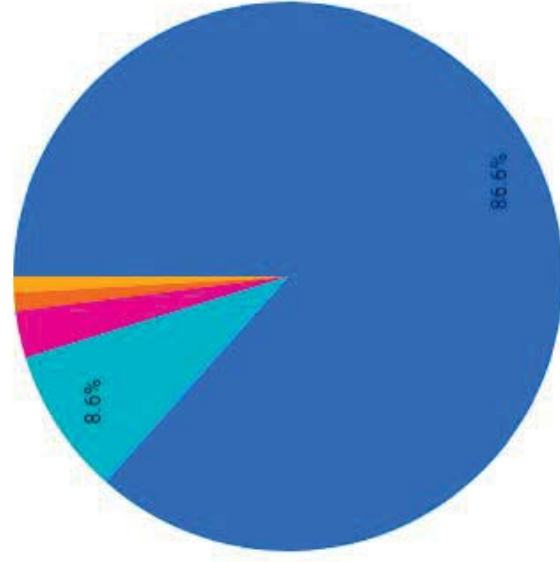


Second Semester Student Enrollment

Total Survey Results: 27,164

- 2020 = 2.943

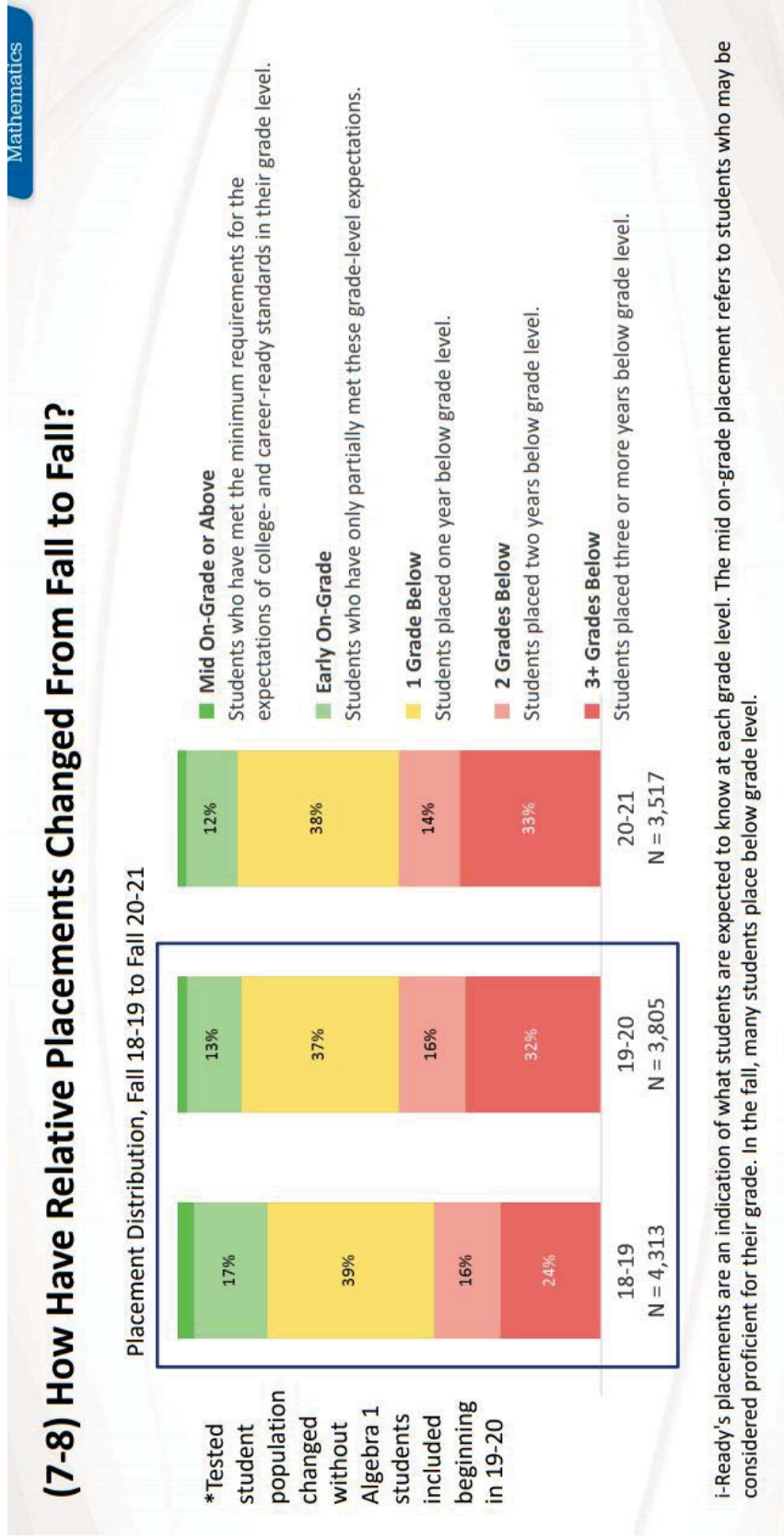


Three Year Trend for i-Ready Data - Math (K-6)

Updated Quarantine Guidelines And Reminders



The CDC released new recommendations last week regarding shortening the quarantine time frame for individuals that have been in close contact with a confirmed positive. Local public health authorities determine and establish the quarantine options for their jurisdictions.

- Per DOH-Clay the quarantine recommendation time frame is being reduced from 14 days to 10 days, effective immediately.
