# Coronavirus Update

## CLAY COUNTY DISTRICT SCHOOLS' CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) PREPARATION FACT SHEET



Clay County District Schools is continuing to track updates regarding the Coronavirus (COVID-19) in collaboration with the Florida Department of Health in Clay County and Clay County Emergency Management. In an effort to protect students and staff, Superintendent David Broskie has directed several actions for the district and schools to decrease the spread of respiratory illnesses like the Coronavirus.

**THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS ARE IN PLACE:**

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**SANITIZATION OF FACILITIES:**
  - Increase cleaning by custodial staff of frequently touched surfaces such as desks, counters, bathrooms, doorknobs, and buses.
  - The District is prepared for extensive disinfecting of an impacted facility with a rapid response team should there be a confirmed case of Coronavirus.
  - All facilities have hand sanitizer available to students and staff and all are encouraged to wash their hands frequently.
- 
**STUDENT ATTENDANCE:**
  - Parents are encouraged to keep sick children home, especially if they are running a fever. Please do not use a fever reducer to send them to school.
  - Students or staff who become sick at school should be sent home as soon as possible.
  - District will monitor changes of absentee patterns throughout schools.
  - Normal school attendance policies remain in effect for all students.
- 
**STUDENT AND EMPLOYEE TRAVEL:**
  - Any school-sponsored or district-sponsored travel to areas deemed to be high-risk by the CDC will be canceled.
  - Any existing out-of-country travel that is not in a high-risk area will be reviewed on a case by case basis.
  - Until further notice, new out-of-country and out-of-state travel requests will not be approved.
  - Until further notice, new in-state travel will be reviewed on a case by case basis.
- 
**OTHER DIRECTIVES:**
  - The District Coordinator of Nursing Services is continuing to update Health Room Nurses daily on any changes through the Centers of Disease Control and National School Nurse Association guidelines.
  - The District will take direction from the Department of Health should there be a confirmed case of Coronavirus in our county and local health officials will provide guidance for any school dismissals.
  - The District is working to find the best way to deliver instruction if a student or school is required to stay home by the direction of the Department of Health.

-  ..... Take flu antivirals as prescribed
-  ..... If you are sick, stay home
-  ..... Wash your hands often with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds
-  ..... Carry and use alcohol-based hand sanitizer
-  ..... Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands
-  ..... Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze
-  ..... Monitor your symptoms
-  ..... Call ahead before visiting your doctor

- 140 more applicants this year compared to last year

- Acceptance and waitlist emails sent to applicants between March 30th- April 3rd.
