School Data



Changes to Reporting of School Grades

- DOE Order No. 2021-EO-02 released on April 9, 2021 allows for school districts to Opt-In to school grades and school improvement ratings.
 - In order to opt-in, a school had to test 90% or more of its eligible student body and decide within 30 days of the release of state testing data.
 - If not opting-in, all schools in Florida will retain their pre-COVID 19 designations.
- On Thursday, July 29th, the State released most student FSA scores to each school district.
- We are still analyzing the data to determine projected school grades.



CCDS 2020-2021 FSA Celebrations

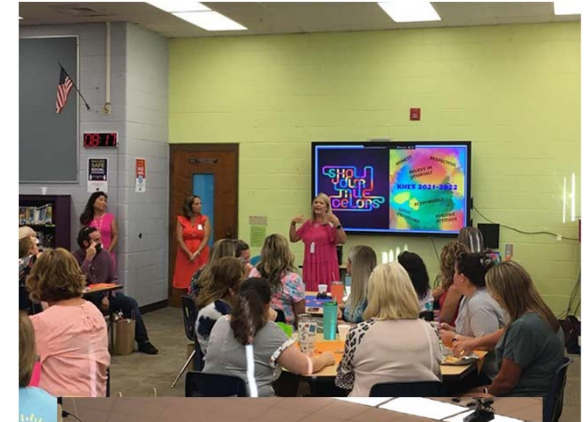
- Clay County scored **above the state average** in every assessment area!
- Clay County scored in the **top 10** of the 67 school districts in the following areas:
 - 9th in Grades 3-10 ELA proficiency
 - 7th in Grades 3-5 ELA proficiency
 - 5th in Grades 6-8 ELA proficiency
 - 9th in Grades 6-8 Math proficiency
 - 5th in Grade 5 Science proficiency
 - 4th in Grade 8 Science proficiency
 - 8th in Biology EOC proficiency
 - 5th in Civics EOC proficiency
 - 3rd in US History EOC proficiency

Mitigation Strategies for COVID-19 within CCDS

- Recommended and highly encouraged use of face coverings when indoors, regardless of vaccination status
- Isolation rooms on all campuses for students and staff exhibiting symptoms or known exposures to COVID-19
- Desks spaced three feet apart or as close to three feet as possible with assigned seating
- Seating charts in the classroom, cafeterias, and school buses.
- Electrostatic sprayers to clean and disinfect classrooms and common areas throughout the day
- Quarantine and contact tracing conducted by Department of Health- Clay
 - Note: if you are fully vaccinated and exposed to someone with COVID-19, per CDC guidelines, you will not need to quarantine if not showing symptoms
- Continued use of our COVID-19 report every Monday detailing the case and quarantine count from the previous week in Clay schools



COVID-19 Safety Reminders for students and staff. Please DO NOT come to school or work if you fall into one of the following scenarios:

- You are awaiting COVID-19 test results (regardless if asymptomatic)
- You are a confirmed positive with COVID-19 and still within the recommended self-isolation timeframe (regardless of vaccination status)
- Someone in the home is exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms and is awaiting test results (*Unless fully vaccinated and showing no symptoms)
- Someone in the home is positive with COVID-19 (*Unless fully vaccinated and showing no symptoms - highly encourage use of face covering)
- You have been contact traced and directed to quarantine from the Department of Health or medical provider
