**NEED FOR CHOICE IN CLAY:**

Cambridge Program and Gifted & Talented are two of the top five Choice programs that elementary parents requested in CCDS. 82% of those surveyed indicated a desire for their school to have Accelerated Learning programs in their children’s schools, and 72% marked college preparatory classes as Very Important or Important. Cambridge Primary and AICE are both equipped to meet these requests and would provide a complete K-12 feeder pattern as shown in the table below.
