

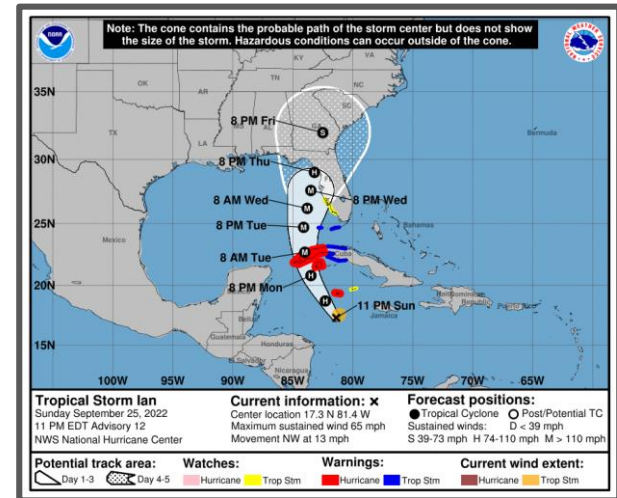


# School District Response to Hurricanes



# Preparing for Hurricanes

- Partner with Clay County Emergency Management to determine possible school closures
  - Five schools serve as shelters
- Meetings with school principals to review safety and sheltering plans
- Meetings with district departments to coordinate support





# Securing District Property

## Pre and Post Storm Assessment

- CCSD Properties
  - 42 schools & 51 total facilities
  - 6,376,624 square footage
  - 1495 acres
- All principals conduct Pre-Storm Assessment to allow time for Operations to correct urgent issues
- All principals conduct Post-Storm Assessment to ensure entire campus is safe for staff and students to return

# Impact on Instructional Hours

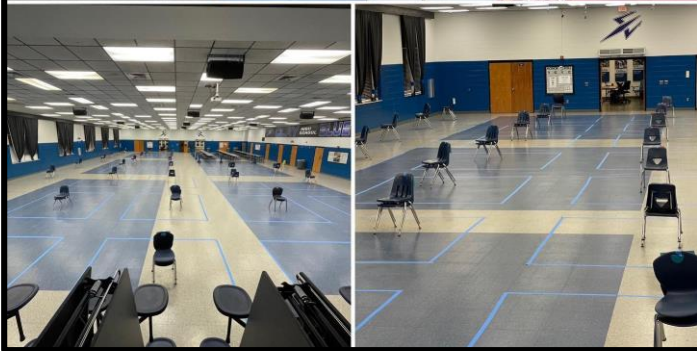
