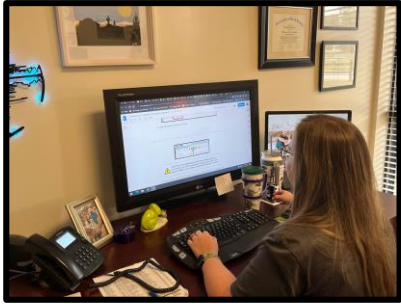

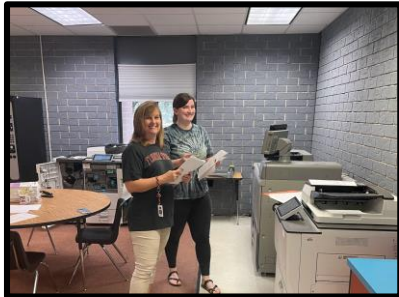

Controlled Open Enrollment

- Controlled Open Enrollment (COE) provides parents and legal guardians of children and youth entering grades K-12 the opportunity to seek enrollment in a school other than the zoned school of attendance.
- In accordance with Florida Statute 1002.31, parents/legal guardians currently residing in any school district in the State of Florida may select schools from a list identified by the Clay County School District as having available seats based upon published guidelines.





Rule Changes to Controlled Open Enrollment (July 1, 2022)


- ★ Accept students throughout the year as capacity becomes available
- ★ Maintain a wait list
- ★ Website must identify school capacity
 - By grade level
 - Update data every 12 weeks
 - Post process required to participate in in COE

Applications will only be accepted for grade levels in the schools that have space availability. All other schools in the district are at 80%+ capacity

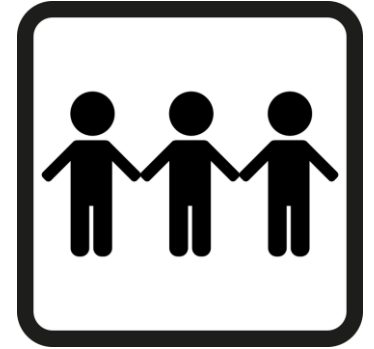

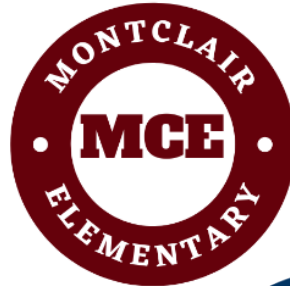
Factors Influencing Capacity

- Capacity = Enrollment at 80% or above state-determined capacity for the school
- Exemptions include...
 - Schools with specialized programs that require lower student to teacher ratios (e.g. Exceptional Student Education programs)
 - Schools in the first three years of operation
 - Schools impacted by redistricting





Current Open Schools



- These schools have at least one open seat in one grade level
- Visit OneClay website to see availability by grade level and to apply for enrollment



Application for 2023-24 School

Year

- The district will update and publish the list of schools with open seats for the 23-24 school year on **May 30**
- Application will be posted on the website
- Once an application for an available seat is received, and space is available, registration information will be sent to the parent through the email provided. Parents have a two week window to complete registration. After two weeks, incomplete registrations will be put on the waitlist.

- Initiative 1.1.7:** Maximize common planning sessions to align content, pedagogy, and assessments with Florida Standards



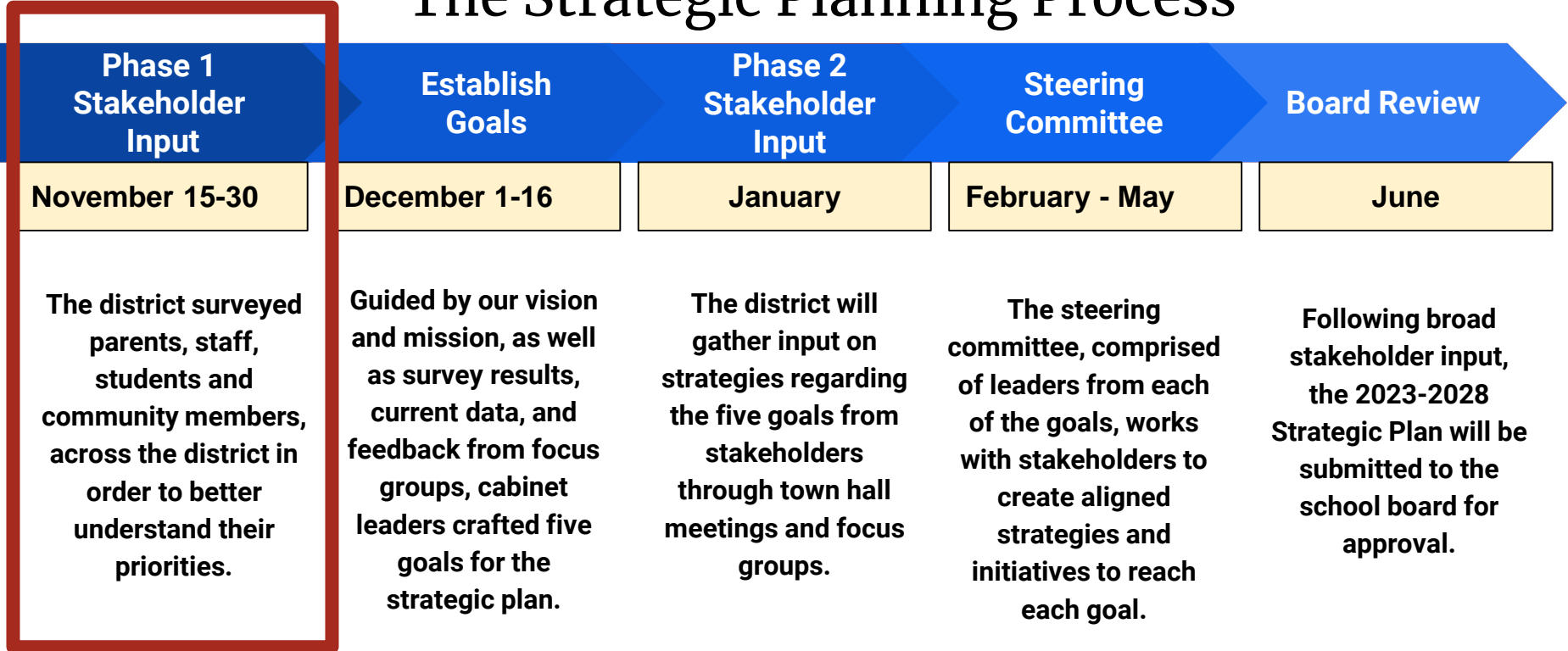

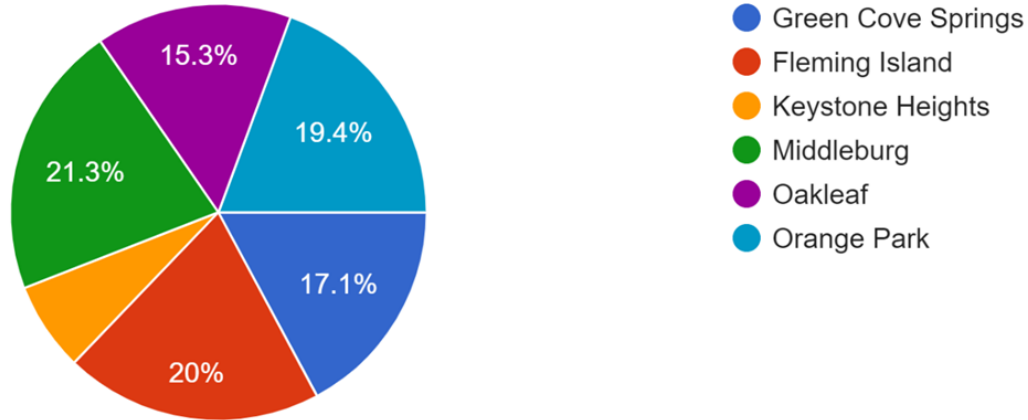

Strategic Planning Survey: Respondents

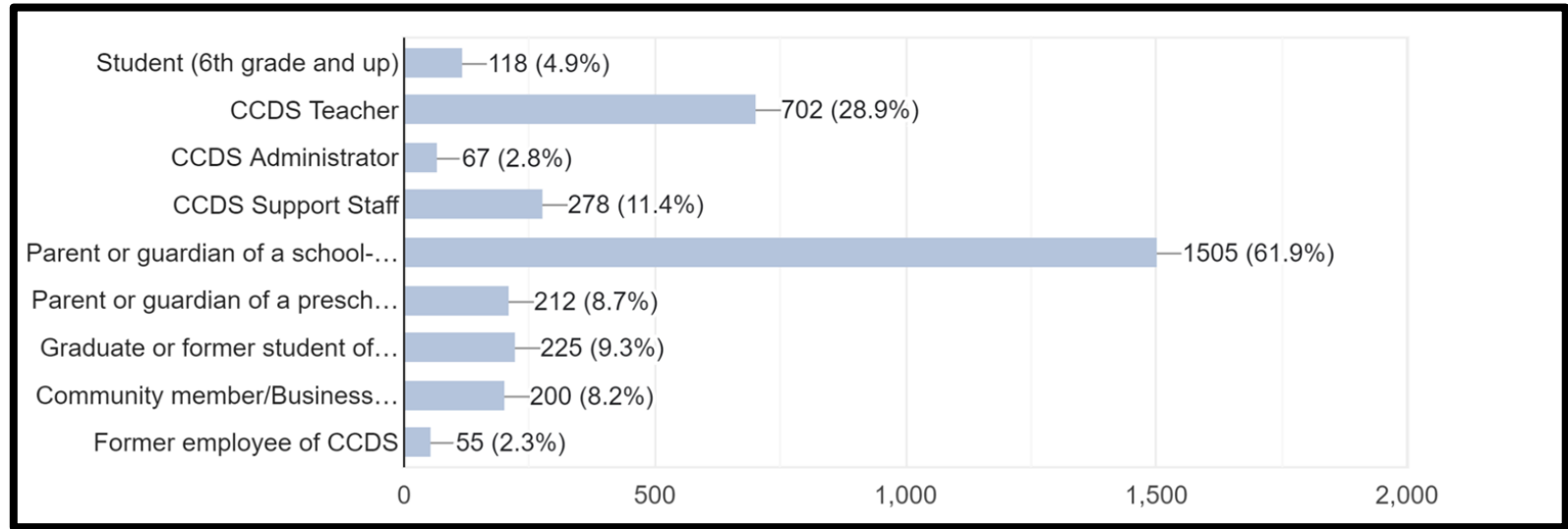
I consider myself part of the following community.

Which of the following categories best describes your role or roles in relation to CCDS?



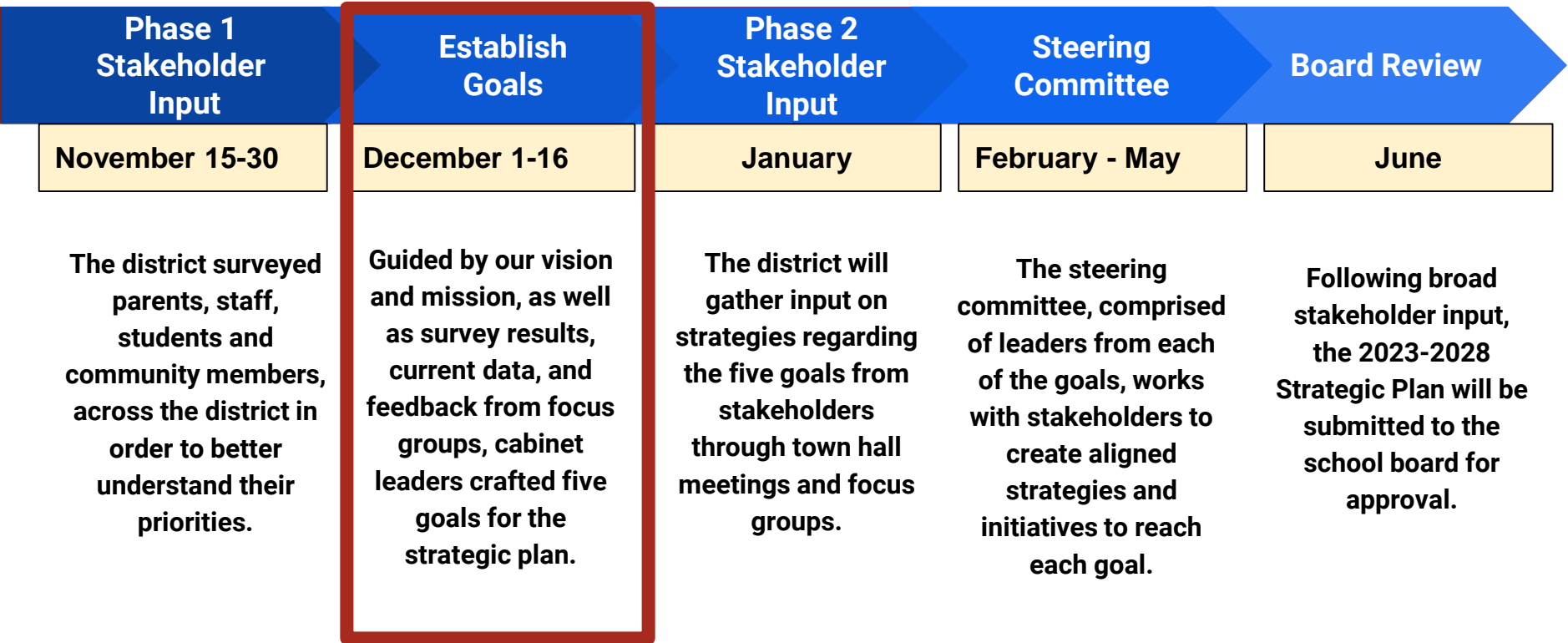


Strategic Planning Survey: Highlights

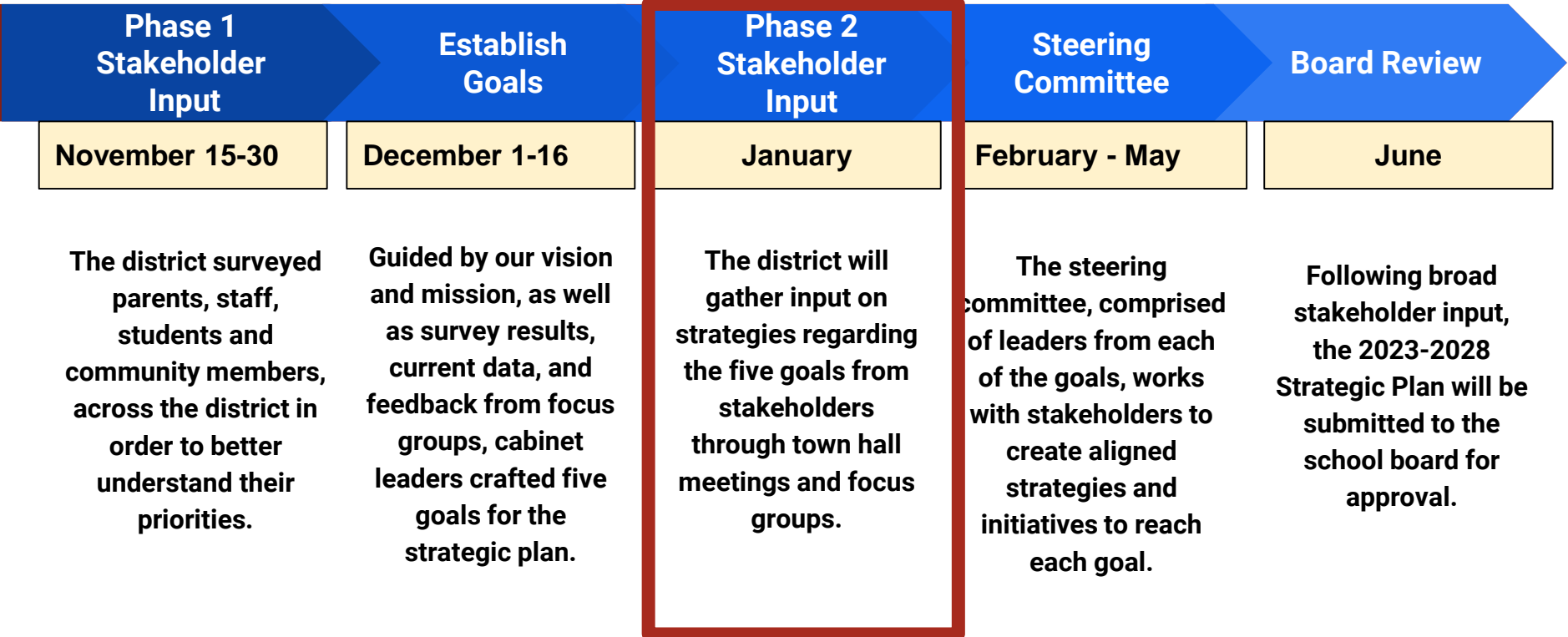
