To teach students by:


- ✓ Using positive and productive adults as role models;

General Purpose of the Performing Arts Academy

"Music is a moral law. It gives soul to the universe, wings to the mind, flight to the imagination, a charm to sadness, gaiety and life to everything. It is the essence of order and lends to all that is good and just and beautiful." --- Plato

- Create an environment where there is joy and excitement in learning.
- Build self confidence that is tied into Performing Arts
- Use early musical training to develop brain areas involved in language and reasoning



- Create Parental Choice and Options
- Create Innovative Learning Opportunities
- Create a Diverse Population of Students and Teachers
- Help Students Learn in a Thematic Institution
- Provide an Opportunity to Enhance the Economic Development of the Community



- In a 2000 survey, 73 percent of respondents agree that teens who play an instrument are <u>less</u> <u>likely to have discipline problems.</u>
 - Americans Love Making Music And Value Music Education More Highly Than Ever, American Music Conference, 2000.
- Students who can perform complex rhythms can also make <u>faster and more precise</u> <u>corrections in many academic and physical situations</u>, according to the Center for Timing, Coordination, and Motor Skills.
 - Rhythm seen as key to music's evolutionary role in human intellectual development, Center for Timing, Coordination, and Motor Skills, 2000.
- A ten-year study indicates that students who study music <u>achieve higher test scores</u>, regardless of socioeconomic background.
 - Dr. James Catterall, UCLA.
- A 1997 study of elementary students in an arts-based program concluded that students' **math test scores rose** as their time in arts education classes increased.
 - "Arts Exposure and Class Performance," Phi Delta Kappan, October, 1998.
- First-grade students who had daily music instruction **scored higher on creativity tests** than a control group without music instruction.
 - K.L. Wolff, The Effects of General Music Education on the Academic Achievement, Perceptual-Motor Development, Creative Thinking, and School Attendance of First-Grade Children, 1992.
