Subject:

School capacity and grade configuration

The Instructional Division recommends the following:

- 1. Open 1 new elementary school in the Oakleaf area in 2008 with the grade configuration of K-5.
- 2. Keep OLS a K-8 school for at least another two school years. However, we believe we should stand firm on not allowing 6<sup>th</sup> graders to participate in the school sports program. If this configuration results in all of our schools going K-5 in the future we would be willing to re-visit the sports rule at that time. To allow 6<sup>th</sup> graders to play at one school and not another would be inequitable at a minimum and create all kinds of problems at a maximum.
- 3. Open 1 new elementary school in the Lake Asbury area in 2008 as a K-6.
- 4. Delay the opening of the second elementary school at OLS until at least 2009. We feel the OLS K-8 will be able to handle the growth for at least two years if not more.
- 5. We recommend opening only two schools a year if at all possible due to the strain on our HR/IS departments. You are talking about hiring approximately 1000 teachers in one summer by opening two schools at the same time. If we can live without opening 3 at once I think that would be the smart thing to do.

We believe going to the K-5 configuration is the way to go for all of our 6<sup>th</sup> graders due to the requirements of the new A++ plan. Currently, if a 6<sup>th</sup> grader fails a subject he must be retained. If 6<sup>th</sup> grade is left in the elementary configuration there is virtually no capacity to offer a 6<sup>th</sup> grader who failed English but passed Science and Math 7<sup>th</sup> grade Science and Math. If he/she were at a 6-8 school we would be able to make accommodations in his/her schedule.
