





Student Engagement YTD 12/10/2023


2023-24 Weekly Core5 Student Usage



K-5 average of time. If daily, 13.4 minutes each day. If 3 times per week, 22 minutes each day.


PowerUp Student Usage YTD 12/10/2023





Educator Logins YTD 12/10/2023






Teachers are logging in daily! This is an increase from last year.

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


