Recap: Library Access Levels

- Parental rights
- Parents choose the level of library access that best suits their child
 - General Access
 - Unlimited Access
 - Limited Access
 - No Access
 - Daily Emails
- Access level chosen by parent upon first login of Synergy for the 2024-2025 school year
- Access levels can be changed by the parent during the year



Challenge & Appeals Process





The Challenge Process

Step 1: The district team pre-screens the request looking at the evidence provided by the petitioner.

Step 2: Compares the evidence to

- Florida Statute
- Board Approved Community Standards

Step 3: Recommendations

- Reject
- Remove
- Retain
- Flag as Parental Advisor Status (high school only)
- Refer to Committee

Step 4: Notify Petitioner



The Appeals Process

- The Petitioner may appeal decision
- Appeal is submitted to the board
- The vote is not a School Board endorsement of the content or subject matter, but a vote to state that the law and policy have been followed
- All decisions of the School Board are final
