Safety and Security in Clay



Action Steps

- ❑ **July:** Superintendent Broskie trained all district and school administrators on safety and security procedures
- ❑ **July:** School administrators create a red safety binder with all state-mandated reports, including an updated school safety plan
- ❑ **July:** CCSPD met with new administrators and SPS admin to review and/or develop the school's CHIRP Plan
- ❑ **August:** Leaders train all staff in safety and security protocols and attest that their campus is fully prepared for students' return





Monthly

- ❑ Schools conduct emergency drills
- ❑ Schools attest to compliance with required safety and security steps in state statute
- ❑ Superintendent Broskie holds a monthly “Superintendent’s Safety and Security Council” to coordinate district efforts to ensure a safe environment to learn and work.
- ❑ District and schools hold a behavioral threat assessment team meeting

Office of Safe Schools (OSS) Visit

Week of November 27, 2023



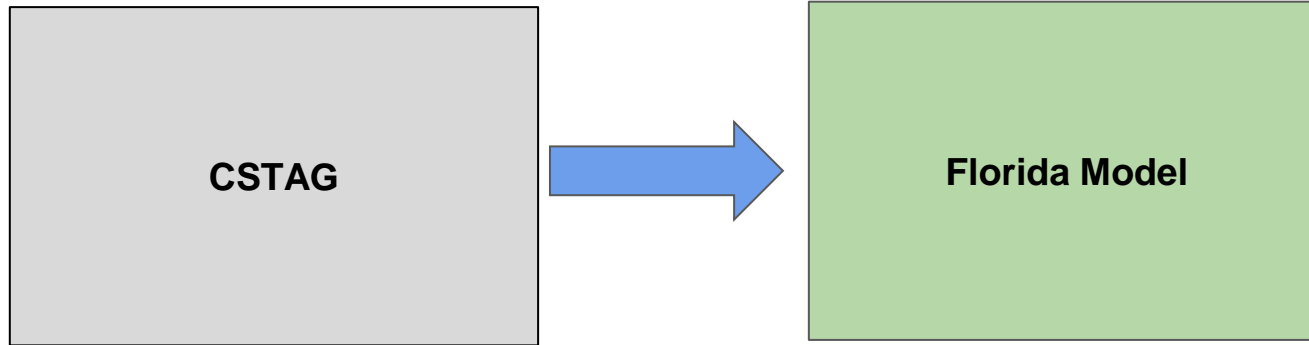
- Office of Safe Schools, including Vice Chancellor Strauss, visited 13 schools to assess compliance with state statutes.
- Reports demonstrated schools met and exceeded compliance standards
- OSS held conversations with leaders regarding continued best practices

Transition to New Harm Prevention and Threat Management Model



All Florida districts will begin using this model beginning January 1, 2024



Threat Management vs. Threat Protocols

Threat Management

A systematic, fact-based method designed to first identify behaviors that constitute a concern for violence or harm to others and then put in place safety measures.

Prevention is the focus of threat management.

Threat Protocol

Threat assessment protocols are used to assess concerning behavior and threats. These are a series of documents, also referred to as a “threat assessment instrument.”

Florida's Harm Prevention and Threat Management Model

- ❑ Still includes a monthly review with school-based and district-based teams with clearly defined roles for members
- ❑ Increases the focus on students with real behaviors of concerns
- ❑ User-friendly levels of concern (high, medium, low unfounded)
- ❑ Monitoring timelines for different levels of concern
