Statute Requirement

Senate Bill 1108 requires the character development curriculum for public school students in the 11th and 12th grades to include instructions on voting using the uniform primary and general election ballot.

In CCDS, instruction should take place in 11th US History, after EOCs in May. It should also take place in 12th US Government. First semester US Govt teachers should time this instruction around the voter registration drive.


