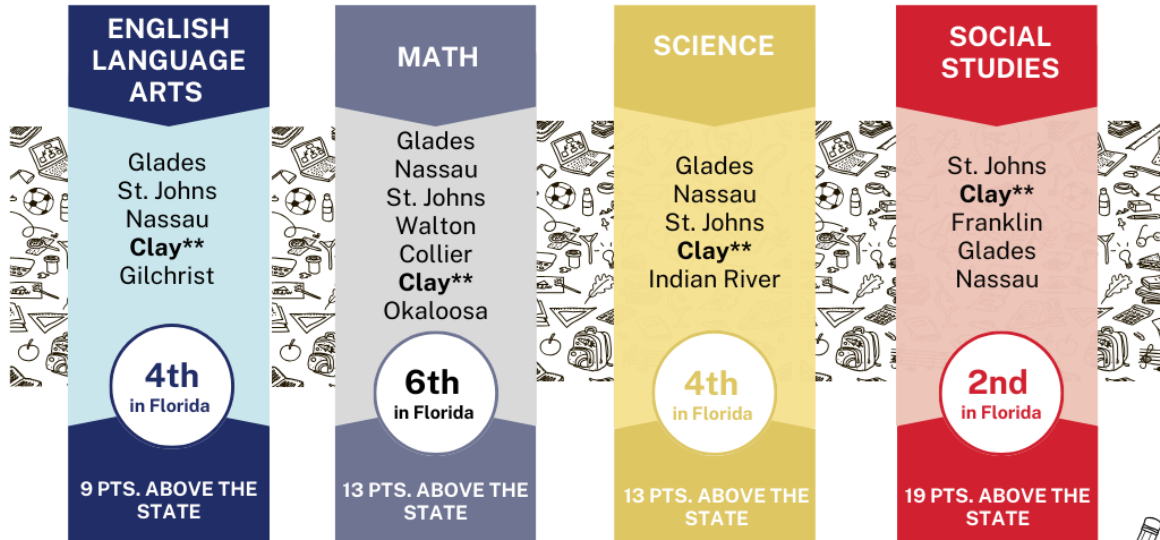
# Proficiency for Students with Disabilities

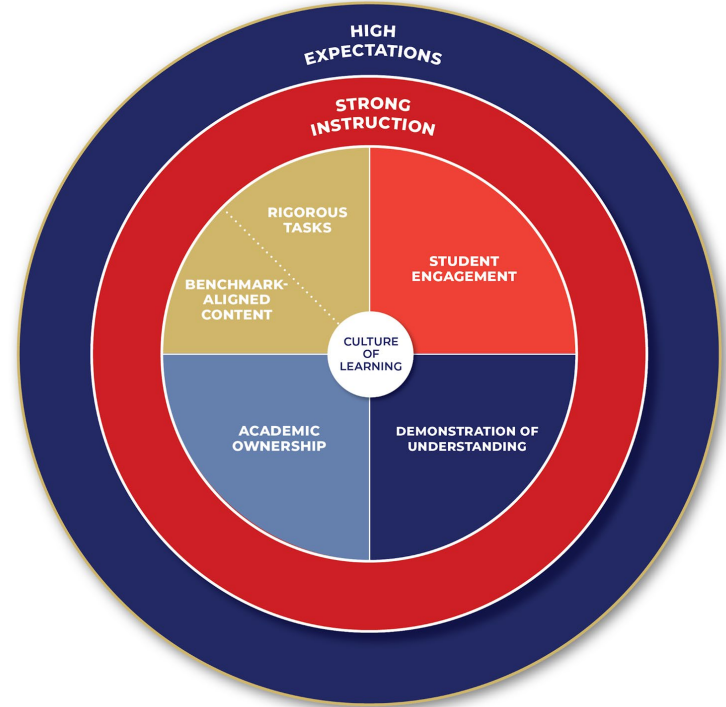

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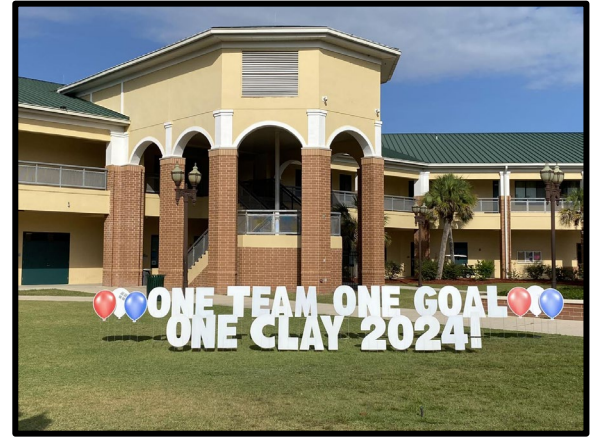

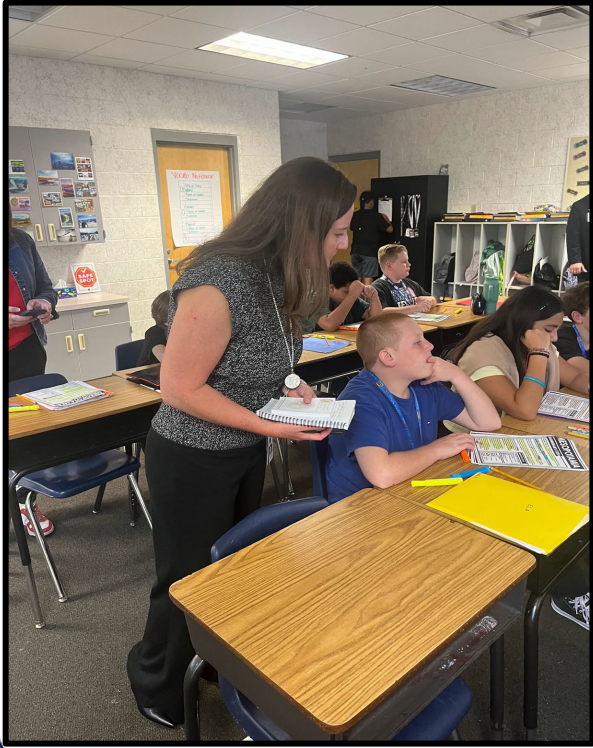

# Monitoring the OneClay Instructional Vision

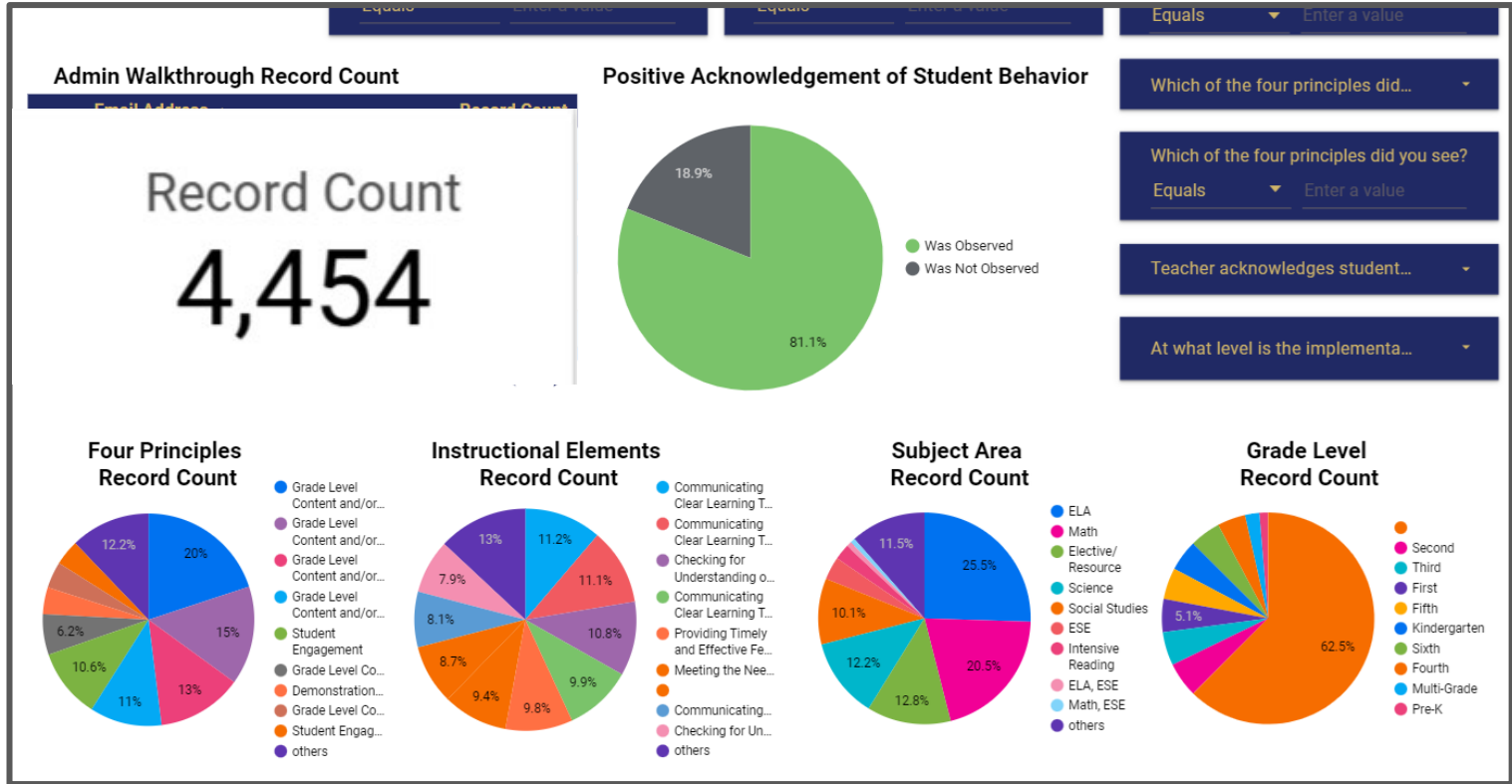

- Feedback provided to teachers

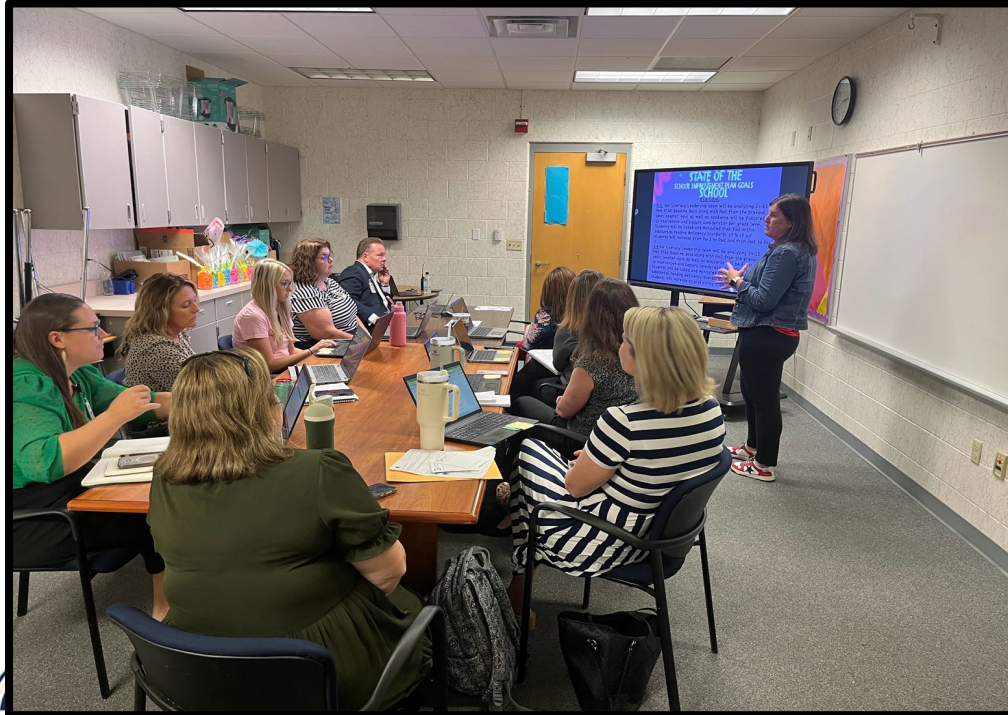

## Learning Walks at School Sites

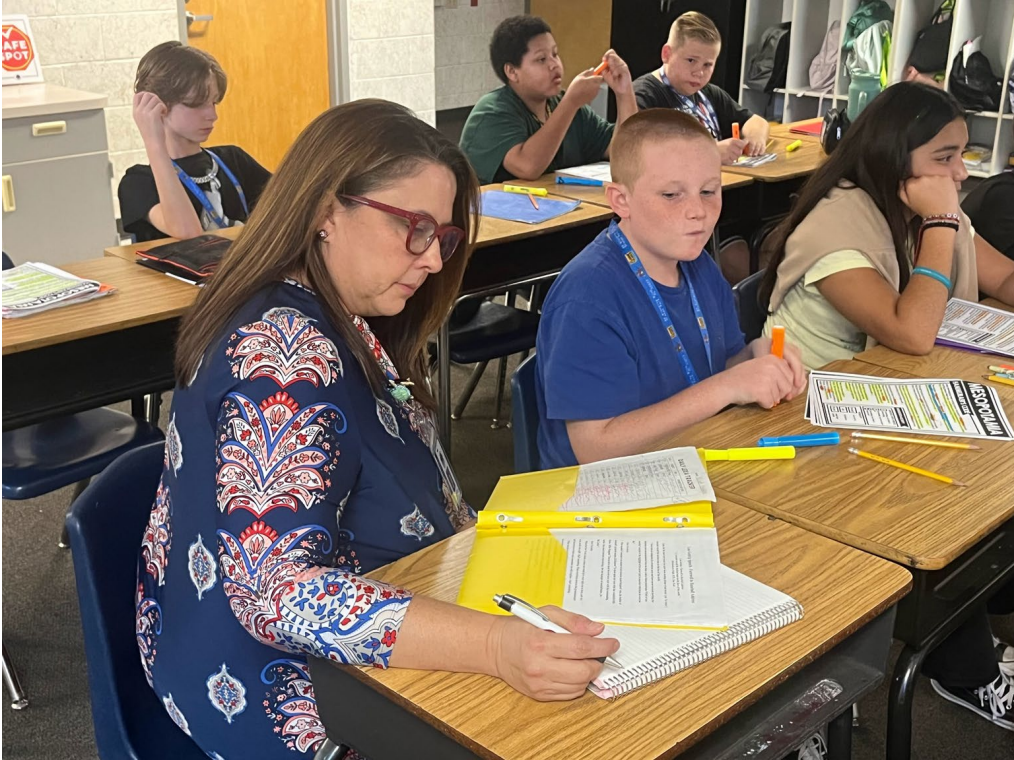
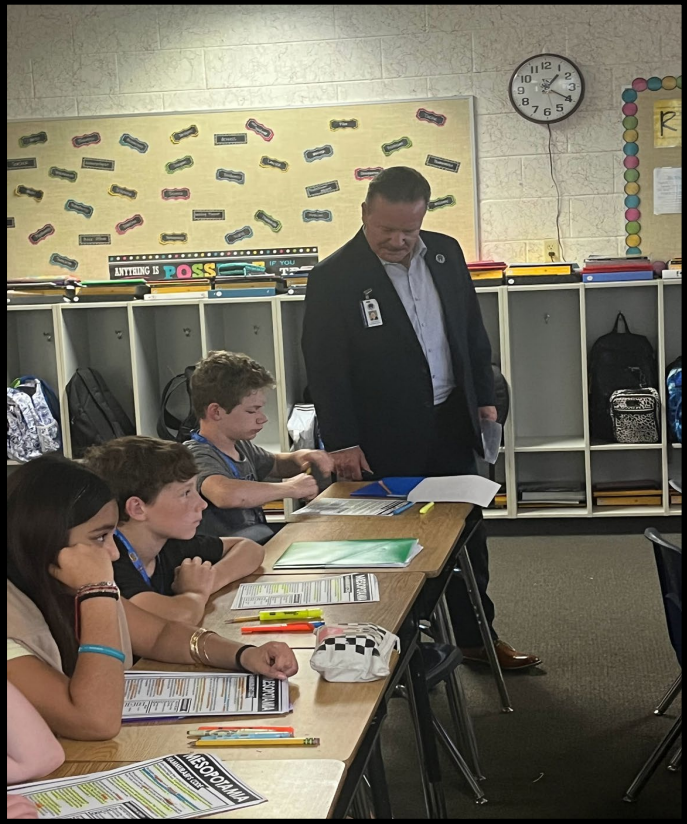


- As of today, we have held 30 comprehensive learning walks

# Professional Learning Communities



A group of teachers who shared students or share content.

They meet once a week with a focus on student learning and a collective approach to meeting all students needs.

Administrators and district coaches and specialists often join these PLCs.



# Professional Learning Communities

## Collaborative Team Actions within our Professional Learning Community

### PLC Critical Questions

1. What do we want students to know and be able to do?
  2. How will we know if they have learned it?
  3. What will we do if they are not learning it?
  4. What will we do when they have learned it?

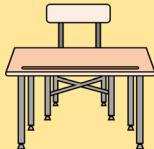
