On 11/22/10 at 0723 hours I responded to 1643 Miller Street (Grove Park Elementary School) in reference to a burglary.

Upon arrival I made contact with Vice-Principle RP, Anthony Bradley. RP stated he was advised by one of his employees IO, Sherlyn Shaw, that portable #10 was broken into. RP stated sometime between 1400 hrs on 11/19/10 and today's date someone broke into portable #10.

Investigation revealed that unknown suspect(s) made entry through an unlocked window on the west side of portable #10. Upon gaining entry the suspect(s) vandalized the inside of the room and its contents. The suspect(s) opened several bottles of colored paint and poured them onto the floor and on two computers. There were also several bottles of stamp ink and cleaning supplies poured out all over the floor. The suspect(s) also knocked over several students' desks and a laser printer causing damage to the printer. The suspect(s) then took a fire extinguisher and discharged it inside of the class room. The dust from the fire extinguisher was all over the room and computers. It is unknown if the dust caused any damage to the computers. The suspect(s) wrote on the chalkboard in blue marker "Never Leave windows open!". The suspect(s) then exited through the northeast door. It is unknown if anything is missing at this time. Estimated amount of damage is about \$2000.

I processed the scene for latent prints. I collected two prints on the outside window of portable #10 and a palm print from the outside window of portable #9. I collected two empty stamp ink bottles and one empty paint bottle from portable #10. The items I collected and a CD containing photos of the scene were placed into property as evidence. RP was issued a case number.

I did a canvass of the area which was met with negative results.

On 11/22/10 at 1520 I responded back to 1643 Miller Street (Grove Park Elementary) in reference to a burglary to a portable #527. RP said someone also broke into portable #527 sometime between 11/19/10 and today's date. The suspect(s) made entry through an unlocked window and vandalized the inside of the class room. There were several items thrown around and knocked over. The bookshelves and computers were all on the floor. The suspect(s) also stuffed miscellaneous items inside the toilet. The suspects wrote on the chalkboard in blue marker "fuck titys balls pussy". It is unknown if the computers are damaged at this time. Estimated amount of damage is about \$300.

I took pictures of the scene and placed them into property as evidence.

CST Hearth arrived, photographed, and processed the scene for evidence. While walking with CST Hearth, I made contact with Ken Wilson from 357 Dillon Drive (618-534-3424) who stated he found a baseball bat on the basketball court. K. Wilson stated he took the bat home.

We also found two boom box radios underneath portable 75. T. Outman stated they belong to the school but doesn't remember what teacher had them last.

I was unable to conduct a canvass because there are no houses that could see where the crimes occurred.

The stolen items were entered into NCIC/FCIC by ECO Saunders # 5028
