

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION OF THE SCHOOL BOARD OF CLAY COUNTY, FLORIDA DETERMINING THAT PROPERTY DESCRIBED AS BUILDING 92 ROOMS 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 AT THE ORANGE PARK HIGH SCHOOL FACILITY, 2300 KINGSLEY AVENUE, ORANGE PARK, FLORIDA ARE NO LONGER ELIGIBLE BY CODE ENFORCEMENT FOR EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES AND WOULD REQUIRE EXTENSIVE REPAIRS FOR ANCILLARY PURPOSES AND HAVE NO COMMERCIAL VALUE AND SHOULD BE DISPOSED OF BY THE MOST ECONOMIC MEANS.

WHEREAS, The School Board of Clay County, Florida wants to dispose of the structures described as relocatable Building 92, Rooms 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 located at the Orange Park High School Facility; and

WHEREAS, the structures have deteriorated, are not cost effective to repair and are no longer utilized, serve no useful function and are without commercial value; and

WHEREAS, Florida Statue 1013.28 requires a determination that said structures are unusable for educational purposes and ancillary purposes and have no commercial value;

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the School Board to dispose of said property by the most economical means of Clay County District Personnel;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the School District of Clay County, Florida, that the following described property is unusable for education and ancillary purposes and is without commercial value and in the best interest of the public should be disposed of by the most economic means. Said property is more particularly described as follows:

Structures: Building 92 Rooms 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12, are relocatable wooden buildings constructed in 1968, currently at Orange Park High School, 2300 Kingsley Avenue, Orange Park, Florida.
