

**CONTRACT FOR SERVICES 2008-2009
THE SCHOOL BOARD OF CLAY COUNTY, FLORIDA AND
CLAY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CENTER**

AGREEMENT made this 17th day of July 2008, by and between the School Board of Clay County (SBCC) and Clay Behavioral Health Center (CBHC).

WHEREAS CBHC can provide prevention/intervention services in the area of the Title IV Safe & Drug-Free Schools program, and

WHEREAS the School Board of Clay County desires to enter into a contract with CBHC for the receipt of the following described services upon the following terms and conditions.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mentioned promises, covenants, and conditions hereafter set forth, it is understood and agreed as follows:

1. The SBCC will pay CBHC the total sum of \$50,000.00 through the continuation of the Safe & Drug-Free Schools Grant which provides support funding for Student Assistance Program (SAP) Counselors at all SBCC secondary schools. The additional costs of SAP Counselors shall be borne by CBHC.
2. Funds for \$50,000.00 will be provided through the Safe & Drug-Free Schools Grant (SDFS) and will make it possible for CBHC to continue as part of the Drug Free School Prevention/Intervention Program of the Clay County School System. The total amount will be paid in ten (10) monthly payments of \$5,000.00 commencing on August 31, 2008.
3. The CBHC staff will provide direct and indirect assistance and support to school personnel in the planning and implementation of the SAP Counselor's services, including:
 - a) coordination between the school's Core Team and the SAP Counselor;
 - b) participation in the Crisis Intervention Team as needed and if training through Clay County has been completed; and
 - c) provide two faculty in-service sessions per year at their local school. In-service sessions to be determined by the local CORE Team leader at each school; and
 - d) provide one faculty in-service session per year at their feeder elementary schools. In-service sessions to be determined by the local CORE Team leader at each school.
 - e) provide group tobacco cessation classes as needed.
 - f) provide ATOD prevention instruction at each junior high as time and resources permit.
4. The CBHC staff will provide direct and indirect assistance and support to Student Services in the planning and implementation of education and prevention programs in the Clay County Public Schools.
5. The CBHC retains administrative supervisory responsibilities for CBHC staff. The SBCC may, however, ensure that the delivery of services is coordinated with and supportive of the primary role of the school system - the education of the child. Both parties shall cooperate in

the development and implementation of mutually acceptable policies and schedules which will govern both the SBCC and CBHC personnel in the delivery of appropriate and effective prevention/intervention activities for the secondary students.

6. The SBCC and CBHC will work together to ensure that appropriate and effective programs are provided to the School Board and the appropriate objectives of the Drug-Free School Prevention/Intervention Program.
7. The CBHC and any of its subcontractors shall be required to indemnify and save harmless the School Board of Clay County from all suits, actions, liabilities, damages, costs and expenses of every name and description brought against the SBCC based on personal injury, bodily injury (including death) or property damages (including destruction), received or claimed to be received or sustained by any person or persons arising from or in connection with any negligent act or omission of the CONTRACTOR or its subcontractors, its officers, employees, agents or assigns.
8. ED80-0008, Certification Regarding Lobbying for Grants and Cooperative Agreements, have been duly signed and submitted to the Florida Department of Education along with appropriate objectives to fund this contract in the application for the 2008-2009 SDFS Grant.
9. State and Federal statutes prohibit discrimination on the basis of race, age, sex, national origin, marital status, religion, or handicaps and both parties to the AGREEMENT fully comply with the terms of these acts.
10. The AGREEMENT can be canceled by either party with 90 days notice.
11. Clay Behavioral Health Center agrees to comply with School Board Policy 4.51, Human Growth and Development.
12. The terms of the "contract addendum" attached hereto are incorporated fully into the terms of this contract.
