On this date and time I was dispatched to the listed address in reference to a reported burglary. Upon my arrival I spoke with the reporting party Ms. Vickie Wilkinson who is the custodian for the Rideout School. She advised she arrived at the school around 0500 hours and entered the school through the front door. Once inside she said she observed broken glass on the floor in the area of the main office. She advised she contacted the Sheriff's Office.

Several Deputies responded to the school and completed a search of the school. Several classrooms were found damaged along with several portable classrooms, which are separate from the main building.

I relocated to the area of the portable classrooms and found the following buildings had been burglarized. Building numbers 10,11,25,27,29,34,33,32,31, and 30 had been burglarized by damaging the door handles. Once inside the suspect(s) pried open the teacher's desk using an unknown pry tool. The suspect(s) then rummaged through the desk drawers removing several items, which were thrown about the classroom.

The suspect(s) then entered the main building by removing the glass from an exterior door of classroom # 346. Once inside the suspect(s) damaged several doors by smashing the glass windows. The suspect(s) then entered the administration area and pried open several desk drawers using an unknown pry tool. The suspect(s) then removed \$425.00 from an envelope, which was inside a file cabinet. The suspect(s) then entered the cafeteria area of the school where the removed several knives from the kitchen. While in this area the suspect(s) attempted to gain entry to the cafeteria office by prying open the door but was unable to gain entry.

At this time Deputy N. Vore responded to the school and processed the damaged areas for evidence. Sgt. Perry, Sgt. Collins, Lt. Stivers, Lt. Gann, and Investigator Rosepiller also responded to the school.

Deputy Vore and I collected (2) screwdrivers, (1) hammer, (1) water bottle, (1) sprite can, (1) windowpane, (1) window frame, and (1) computer cable and black bag through out the school grounds, which were placed in to evidence.

At this time this case was assumed by Investigator Rosepiller. This case is being transferred to the Sheriff's Office Youth Resource Unit.

On 05-10-2006 at approximately 0700 hours while performing my duties as a school resource officer at Middleburg High School, I responded to portable building #44 in regards to a theft investigation.

On arrival I made contact with teacher Mr. Audie Boggs in the portable classroom. Mr. Boggs informed me that prior to school and upon entering his locked portable this morning he noticed the VCR/DVD combo player was missing from the television display area. He stated that he observed the cable wires that were connected to the player had been cut and left attached to the wall outlet and television. Mr. Boggs told me that he checked the other exterior door to the portable at this time and found it secured. He stated that he then contacted the front office in regards to the item missing. I then obtained the serial number to the stolen item from Assistant Principal Tara Richardson at this time.

On investigation I observed that the lever type door handle on the westside of the building was damaged. I found the door secured however the guts to the door handle appeared to be damaged. It appeared that the unknown suspect(s) pried/pushed down on the door handle to gain entry inside. I observed a partial shoeprint on the exterior surface of the door near the handle that I took a photo of. I processed the interior and exterior surface of the door with black powder for suspect latent prints with negative results due to the coarse surface material of the door. I attempted to lift the partial shoeprint off of the door with negative results. I then took photos of the area that the VCR was taken from as well as the cut to the cable wires. I then collected the cable wires to be submitted as evidence. I then conducted a check around the portable for usable physical evidence with negative results. During this time I was informed by teacher Mrs. Glenna Grant that it appeared that her portable #55 had been entered into as well.

I conducted a check of Mrs. Grant's door and did not observe any sign of forced entry to the door. The doors handles to this portable were of the round standard type and did not appear tampered with. I did not observe and pry marks one the doors at this time. I then located a window on the southside of the portable that was unlocked and it appeared that the window screen had been pried as the screen was still attached to the window. I then processed the window and window screen for suspect latent prints with negative results. Mrs. Grant informed me that it appeared that her file cabinet had been entered and that a teacher's edition of an algebra book was missing from her desk. I then processed the exterior and interior doors of the file cabinet for latent prints with no latent prints being collected. I then took photos of the cabinet and window to the portable at this time. I conducted a check around the exterior of the portable for usable physical evidence with negative results.

I was then was advised by teacher Mr. Joel Burghart that his laptop computer was missing from his portable classroom #42. On investigation I observed that the northside lever type door handle to the portable room had been tampered with to gain entry. It appeared that the suspect(s) forced down on the handle to gain access inside. Mr. Burghart told me that upon entering the room he noticed two pairs of scissors laying on the floor next to his desk. He stated that he then noticed his personnel laptop computer was missing from a projection cart in the room. I then processed the exterior and interior surface of the doors for suspect(s) latent prints with negative results. I took photos of the scissors on the floor and collected the scissors to be submitted as evidence for processing. I conducted a check of the exterior of the portable for usable physical evidence with negative results. I collected the serial numbers to the laptop computer from Mr. Burghart at this time to be entered into the system.

I made contact with Sgt. D. Lee #717 and informed him of the burglary to the portables at this time. Upon

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Investigator C. Rosepiler arrival I advised him of the incident and of the evidence that I collected for submission.

At approximately 1100 hours I was advised by Vice Principal Ms. Jill Palmer that teachers Mrs. Dawn Powers and Kim Lanoux had discovered items missing from within their classroom portables which were in the same area of the other portables that were burglarized. I then made contact with Mrs. Powers in portable #54. Mrs. Powers informed me that she discovered an old school radio boombox was missing from her room. She stated that the radio was kept on a television cart in the room. She informed me that it did not appear that any other items were disturbed in the room. I conducted a check of the windows to the room and found them secured. I conducted a check of the doors to the portable and did not observe any sign of forced entry to the doors. Due to the material of the television stand I did not locate any suspect latent prints. Mrs. Powers could not provide me with the brand name or serial numbers to the radio at this time. I later processed the exterior surfaces of the doors however due to the coarse material I did not locate any suspect latent prints.

I then made contact with Mrs. Lanoux in portable #51 at which time she informed me that her school issued digital camera was missing from her desktop in the room. She told me that she did not believe any other items were disturbed within the room. I conducted a check of the windows to the room and found them secured. I also did not observe any sign of forced entry to the doors at this time. I conducted a check around the exterior of the portable for usable physical evidence with negative results at this time. I did not locate any suspect latent prints on Mrs. Lanoux desk due to the wood surface. Mrs. Lanoux could not provide me the serial numbers to the Sony camera at this time. At report time I was not able to make contact with the afternoon janitors in regards to the portable classrooms being secured.

Upon arrival I made contact with Charles Miller, Head Custodian at RidgeView Elementary. Charles stated at approximately 0645 hours he observed that RidgeView Elementary School had been burglarized.

Charles stated that it appeared that unknown subject/s made entry into the Administration Building by means of breaking the glass panel located on the Library door, Building # 33. Charles stated that once inside the suspect/s located a fire extinguisher and discharged the fire extinguisher in the News Room.

Charles stated that the News Room contained several video cameras and other audio video equipment, which were covered in a blanket of white dust. Charles stated that the subject/s then entered into the Teachers Lounge. Once inside Charles stated that the subject/s took several food and drink items from the refrigerators and emptied them on the floor.

Charles stated that the subject/s used some type of pry tool on the vending machine located in the Teachers Lounge. Charles advised that once inside the machine the subject/s took all the money from the machine. Charles stated that it was unknown the amount of money that was taken.

Charles stated that the subject/s made entry into room # 112 where a lock box was kept. Charles stated that there was no money kept inside the box.

I observed all areas that were mentioned by Charles. Myself and Charles checked each portable. We discovered that several portables were broken into. The portables that were entered are as follows:

Portable 760, subject/s made entry into the front door by means of breaking the door handle, it did not appear that any items were taken. Portable 745, subject/s made entry into one of the doors, unknown which door, due to both handles being broken. \$20.00 cash was taken from this portable. Portable 749, entry was made into the portable using one of the doors, unknown which door, due to both locks being broken. \$6.00 cash was taken from this portable.

Portable 756, entry was made into the portable using the back door. The subject/s broke the door handle. No money was taken. Portable 755, Entry was made via back door. The subject/s broke the handle. \$4.00 cash was taken from this portable. Portable 734, Entry was made using one of the two doors. It was unknown which door was entered, due to both doors handles being broken. \$6.00 cash was taken from this portable.
