FIRST AMENDMENT TO SCHOOL AFFILIATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN CLAY COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD AND ORANGE PARK MEDICAL CENTER

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO SCHOOL AFFILIATION AGREEMENT (the "Amendment"), entered into as of ______, is by and between Clay County School Board ("School") and Orange Park Medical Center ("Hospital") (collectively referred to herein as the "Parties").

WHEREAS, School and Hospital entered into that certain Affiliation Agreement, dated as of August 16, 2011, for the School to provide its students with clinical learning experiences at Hospital (the "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, effective May 28, 2013, School and Hospital desire to amend the Agreement as described herein to provide for a change of the terms of the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Amendment.

- A. The Agreement is hereby amended by adding the following new subsection 3 to paragraph C, as follows:
- 3. The parties agree to establish each year a list of sponsorship opportunities, whereby Hospital and School will jointly prepare a listing of potential items and services that will enhance and promote the parties' affiliation with each other for the benefit of the School's students. The list will be prepared by March 31st of each year, and will be added as an attachment to the Agreement after written approval by each party. Attached to this Amendment as an example, entitled "Orange Park High School Health Science Program Sponsorship Opportunities" is a draft list for 2013. Both parties will endeavor to contribute funding, volunteer services, equipment and other items and services to best serve the needs of the students and the community. Hospital shall be given first right of refusal to be the hospital sponsoring and participating in the Orange Park High School Health Science program. This provision shall not survive the termination of this Agreement.
 - **B.** The Agreement is further amended by adding a new paragraph T, as follows:
- **T.** Existing Health Science Program Sponsorships: So long as this Agreement remains in force, Hospital desires and intends to create a similar sponsorship agreement with additional existing programs in Clay County. Hospital has a long-standing supportive relationship of the programs and student learning outcomes identified at the following schools and desires to establish sponsorships in subsequent school years with the Health Science Programs at:
 - 1. Middleburg High School
 - 2. Clay High School
 - 3. Oakleaf High School

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2. Ratification. The Agreement is hereby modified to the extent, but only to the extent, necessary to reflect the specific changes in this Amendment.
