

Summary of Changes to Code of Conduct
2008-09

- Added the following statement on page 6 of ECOC and page 9 of SCOC
“Financial inability to provide necessary clothes for the student when reported by the parent in writing to the Superintendent and validated by the Superintendent (FS 1003.24(3))”
 - Added Hazing to Level IV Violations on page 28 of ECOC and page 31 of SCOC
 - Added Exceptions to release of student records on page 30 of ECOC and page 33 of SCOC
Exceptions include:
 - Changes noted below to Internet User Guidelines page 40 of ECOC and page 43 of SCOC
- I. **E-Mail Policies:**
- A. ~~No Individual e-mail accounts for students enrolled in grades K-12 will be established by the school district for students enrolled in grades K-6 on an as-needed basis;~~
 - B. No student may access his or her own external e-mail accounts;
 - C. ~~Teacher directed accounts for students are acceptable as follows:~~
 - 1. ~~Only class accounts may be established for grades K-6;~~
 - 2. ~~Students in grades 7-12 may have individual accounts for legitimate educational purposes as determined by the school principal;~~
 - F. It shall be the responsibility of the sending party to maintain a copy of original e-mail transmissions ~~if~~ as required under the public records law;
- Added the term “digital files” to Use of student work, videos, and photographs section on page 42 of ECOC and 45 of SCOC

“From time to time, students have the opportunity to be videotaped, photographed, or display artwork or digital files. Some of these tapes, photographs, digital files or artwork may be included in the local news, on the school’s CCTV or web page, and may eventually air on the School District of Clay County educational channel or be used at local, state or national conferences.”
 - Secondary Code - Pg. 3 added to student responsibility for makeup due to absences (1 day per each day of absence).

Club members cannot be hazed. (School Board Policy 4.11) Hazing means any action or situation that recklessly or intentionally endangers the mental or physical health or safety of a student. Hazing includes any forced activity that could adversely affect the mental health or dignity of the student. (FS 1006.135(1))
Students, talk to your parents and school administrators about any activity you feel uncomfortable about. Demeaning or dangerous activities are not necessary to be a part of a team/group.
