Career Shadowing

The career shadowing experience gives students exposure to the workplace in an occupational area of interest of the student. This is made possible through a partnership with The Clay County Chamber of Commerce.





CCUA Internships

The Clay County School Board and the Academies of Clay along with the Clay County Utility Authority have joined forces in offering internships to local students. Both organizations recognize that careers in our business community require higher academic and technical skills. To prepare for a challenging new labor market, the Clay County School District has created the Academies of Clay program that offers a type of school-within-a-school. One component of the Academies program is its partnerships with employers. This is where the new relationship with CCUA comes into play. CCUA offers and internship to students within the Academies. We are pleased to say we currently have 3 interns employed with CCUA.



Construction Career Days

 The Florida Department of Transportation sponsors Construction Careers Day. The goal of Construction Careers Days is to educate students on career opportunities in Northeast Florida in the construction industry. This includes engineering, environmental sciences, CADD, project management and more. Student activities include career center displays, equipment operations, and learning labs. The Career Center is a trade show set-up where students can learn about opportunities from vocational schools, colleges, contractors, and trades. In 2015, 4 students in Clay County received a scholarship awarded through this program.



AICE Career Fair

Business partners in the Academy of Visual and Performing Arts were set up at the AICE Career Fair allowing students the opportunity to speak one on one with employees about their line of work. 45 students rotated in and out of the TTC throughout the event. This is the fourth career fair this year sponsored by the AICE Advisory Board. The first three themes were based on results of the FLCHOICES career assessment given to students last year. The Performing Arts theme was based on the entire 9th grade assessment results this year via Navigator (MyCareerShines).







Health Career Days

• This event is being held March 29, 2016 at St. Johns River State College. The Clay County School District will have 80 students participate from 3 schools who have passed their CNA exam or will take the exam before the end of the school year. Employers at the Career Fair are specific to the health Care industry and are looking to fill vacancies within their companies. This is an opportunity for seniors to secure employment using their certification immediately after high school.
