Case Narrative

On 1-12-2008, I, Officer Borrero (#16257), responded to 4151 Conroy Road (BJ's Restaurant) reference a vehicle burglary. Upon arrival I met with victim Matthew Boyack, who stated verbally and in a sworn written statement the following:

The victim stated at approximately 1900 hours he arrived and parked in the parking lot for BJ's. He locked the doors and he did not have an alarm system to activate. He entered the restaurant and left around 2050 hours to find the driver side passenger window smashed, and his laptop bag missing from the back seat. The bag (\$40) contained a Dell laptop computer (\$1500), three teacher's edition textbooks (\$300), and numerous school related items (\$50).

The victim stated he spoke to the person parked to the left of his vehicle and they stated they arrived at approximately 1930 hours and did not notice any damage to his vehicle. He also spoke with the driver for the vehicle to the right of his and they stated they noticed several males in a 2000 or 2001 silver Eclipse at approximately 1900 hours.

The victim stated he did not give anyone permission to break his window and remove any items and he will prosecute.

The victim stated he will call with the serial number.

I observed the driver's side passenger window smashed. The vehicle could not be processed because it was wet from the rain. The victim received a copy of his statement and a Victim Rights Booklet.

On 03-07-2008 I responded to Middleburg High School, in regards to someone entering the main building and causing damage to several vending machines inside.

On arrival I made contact with responding deputy D. McDaniels #06557 in the school cafeteria. Deputy McDaniels told me that on his arrival school janitor Mr. Do informed him that he observed the vending machines near the gym area and social studies hallway had been vandalized. Deputy McDaniels told me that he then conducted an exterior search of the school at which time he observed forced entry to window of room #184. He stated that he observed several cereal boxes on the window ledge had been disturbed. He told me that on further investigation it was determined that the office door in the cafeteria had been pried opened with a pry type tool and numerous desks draws within were disturbed. Deputy McDaniels informed me that he had processed the cafeteria office for suspect(s) latent prints and collected several pieces of evidence around the vending machines. I was informed that no other rooms within the school were disturbed on his search. I then made contact with school principal Mr. Broskie and requested that the vending machines remained secured for further processing as well as informing the teachers to contact us if they discover any other rooms entered and not disturbing those area further.

On investigation it was determined that the exterior and interior doors leading into the cafeteria office area where secured on the cafe workers arrival this morning. I observed no sign of forced entry to the doors. I did however observe a service window leading to the office area within the cafeteria was opened which should have been closed. Upon processing the area for suspect(s) latent prints and shoeprints, I located a print impression on the smooth surface and observed it did not contain any detail indicating the suspect(s) possibly was wearing gloves. I processed the vending machines within the school for suspect latent prints with negative results. I then collected one of the cereal boxes from room #184 which contained a tennis type shoe impression to be submitted into evidence upon determining that it did not match Deputy McDaniels shoe. I made contact with Mr. Broskie and requested that teacher Mr. D. Weeks start reviewing the video surveillance system within the school for suspect(s) leads.

I was informed by Mr. Broskie during first period that several teachers in the portable classrooms on the west side of the property (Island area) had discovered that forced entry had been made through the back doors of the portable buildings and that desk and cabinet draws had been disturbed. I then conducted a search of the exterior area of the Island area for usable physical evidence with negative results. On investigation it was determined that approximately thirteen exterior lever type door handles had been damaged on the back doors to the portables. It appeared that the suspect forced the door handles either down or up to gain access to the portable classrooms. It was determined that the televisions/vcr, dvd, cassette players and computers had not been disturbed in any of the portables. I was informed however that the closets and teacher's desk and cabinets within the classes had been gone through by the suspect(s). It was determined that money was taken from the teacher desk in portable classrooms #P63 and P77. I made contact with dispatch and requested that an evidence technician respond to the school to process the area. Lt. Gaden #820 had requested that Investigator Rosepiler respond to the scene to take control of the investigation. Upon Deputy W. Janssen #06179 arrival I advised him of the areas that I needed processed. On Investigator Rosepiler's arrival, I advised him of the incident and he assumed the investigation. Sgt. D. Lee #717 responded to the scene as well.

I made contact with Pepsi employee Mr. Ingram on his arrival and was advised that four of the vending machines would have to be replaced. It appeared the suspect used a pry tool on the money slot area to gain access to the

money inside. Mr. Ingram informed me that approximately \$625.00 dollars was stolen from within the machines. Mr. Ingram was provided with a case number for the incident. At report time he did not provide the insurance information to the machines.

On further investigation during monitoring lunch periods for a student matching the suspects description, I observed that student Chase Austin was wearing a pair of shorts that matched the ones from the video. I also observed that he had a book bag which appeared to be the same color as the one in the video. I was aware that Austin had been arrested for burglary in the past. I made contact with back with Investigator Rosepiler and informed him of the discovery. I was advised that he would follow-up on the lead Monday and did not want me to make contact with the student.

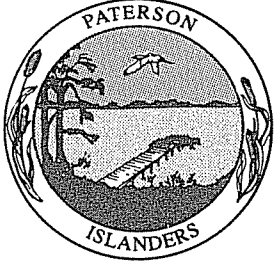
