- Assurance is hereby provided that project funds will be made available to allow project managers to attend four project workdays and any BEESS meetings directly related to project implementation activities.
- All start-up activities which include the provision of direct service to students with emotional disabilities and their families will adhere to the following guidelines prior to implementation:
 - the provision of these services is warranted based on the need to fill gaps to improve services as identified by the project's advisory board;
 - > funds to provide these services are not available at this time;
 - > funding these services does not supplant existing services supported by other funding sources; and
 - > a time frame is established for discontinuation of the support.
- All application revisions, including those which do not require prior approval, will be incorporated into project records and disbursement reports in an accurate and timely manner.
- Funds will be used in such a manner that the effects of funds used in other programs are neither duplicated nor counteracted.
- Funds will be used to increase the impact of funds available under other programs.

- When direct services are pilot activities, the project will implement a plan to evaluate the
 efficacy of the activity consistent with the Florida Continuous Improvement Model and

Project Abstract

The Region IV Multiagency Network for Severely Emotionally Disturbed Students (SEDNET) has been instrumental in establishing a comprehensive system of care for students with emotional handicaps and severe emotional disturbances. Pursuant to 230.2391,F.S., these students are provided with an integrated education and treatment program and have access to a broad array of school, home, and community based services. SEDNET will continue to support and implement intense community based planning in District IV at both the system level and the case level. Therapeutic services have been added to the system of care. Students with emotional disturbances are able to remain at home and attend local schools; length of stays in residential treatment have been shortened; students are placed in residential treatment in a more timely manner; and the numbers of students waiting for residential treatment has greatly been reduced.

SEDNET continues to be a vital source of data on current system resources. This data captures possible gaps in resources, strengths and weaknesses of resources, and best practices. SEDNET also provides leadership for multiagency groups. This function encompasses support for schools; support and guidance to Family Service Planning Team; and collection, analyzation, and distribution of statistical data.

Project initiatives will continue to strive to improve local services to severely emotionally disturbed and emotionally handicapped students and their families. All project activities are based on the belief that the system of care for EH/SED student should be student and family centered and community based. Project activities will strive to improve academics and behaviors; increase numbers mainstreamed, participation in vocational education, graduation and employment rates; and reduce suspensions and expulsions.

SEDNET currently includes the counties of Baker, Clay, Duval, Nassau, and St. Johns. Project goals, objectives and activities are recommended and reviewed by a local advisory board which is made up of representatives of education, mental health, Department of Children and Families, Juvenile Justice, parents, and the community.

During this grant period, the local SEDNET Advisory Board determined emphasis would be placed on the following:

- Training for parents, educators, and professionals working with EH/SED students.
 Strategic Imperative 1. DOE Goal 4.
- Improve transition for EH/SED students to Independence. Strategic Imperative 6. DOE Goal 3.
- Improve, coordinate, and enhance school and community based services for EH/SED students. Strategic Imperative 1. DOE Goal 1.

Direct Services to EH/SED students and/or their families will strive to meet these needs. They will be strategically provided to ensure the continuity of care both in school and the community. In order to provide quality services and positive outcomes, SEDNET will work to increase the resource base and interagency collaboration and linkages. To operationalize better services SEDNET will strive to initiate policies and interagency agreements.

SEDNET will continue to develop, assist and implement training services to keep professionals, systems, and services up to date and functioning well on behalf of students and their families.
