
2011 Legislative Priorities



THE FOLLOWING REPRESENT THE CLAY COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD'S PRIORITIES FOR 2011:

FUNDING

- ◆ Enforce the Florida Constitution as it relates to the provision of adequate and equitable funding for a uniform, efficient, safe, secure, and high quality system of free public schools.
- ◆ The 2 mill discretionary capital levy for public school districts should be reinstated. No portion of the 2 mill levy should be used as a revenue source for the FEFP.
- ◆ Identify and approve revenue streams to compensate for the loss of Federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act dollars and for the continuing decline of state and local revenues.
- ◆ Return the collection rate for property taxes from 96% to 95%.
- ◆ Provide legislative relief for Class Size Amendment.

INSTRUCTIONAL

- ◆ Oppose any existing or new unfunded mandates.
- ◆ State funding must be provided for infrastructure, hardware, maintenance, internet connections and the band width increase that is needed for required on-line assessments.
- ◆ Return the Early Childhood Professional Certification form from the National CDA to ECPC as it appeared on the original CAPE funding list.

HUMAN RESOURCES

- ◆ Protect the Florida Retirement System as it currently exists.
