Student Progression Through the Grades

General:

FCAT Sunshine State Standards changed to Next Generation Sunshine State Standards

Statutes were checked and updated as appropriate

Elementary Section:

- P. 15 (Reading instruction) will include a required 90 minute reading block...
- P. 16 (Added to list of strategies)
 - Intensive Immediate Intervention (iii) outside the 90 minute reading block if deficiency is in reading.
- P. 17-18 Progress Monitoring Chart: Delete in K-3 statements referencing DIBELS For all grade levels K-6 add the following statement to the chart:
 - · Scoring in red success zone -FAIR
 - · Scoring in yellow success zone -FAIR if supported by other data
- P. 21 Delete DIBELS Add FAIR in description of Florida Kindergarten Readiness Screener (FLKRS)
- P. 22 Update guidelines related to participation of Students With Disabilities (SWD) in state and district assessments
- P. 23 Add note that ESE students with significant cognitive disabilities in grades K-2 are evaluated with a modified report card
- P. 26 Statement to clarify that year long honor roll requires achieving honor roll each grading period
- P. 29 Clarification...a student is exhibiting substantial reading difficulty, the student must receive intensive reading instruction both during and outside the 90 minute reading block.
- P. 32 Clarify language in C(b)2 "a score at the 45th percentile or higher..."
- P. 32 Delete (B-C) references to DIBELS which is no longer used

- P. 34 Replace Diagnostic Indicators of Basic Early Learning Skills (DIBELS) with Florida Assessment In Reading (FAIR) in (c)b
- P. 35 Revised A.3 to indicate the SAT-10 may be administered two times rather than one.
- P. 40 Add explanation of choice of Virtual School full-time for K-5 and full-time or part- time for Grade 6. The statute was referenced along with stating the criteria for participation.

Secondary Education Section:

Page 44 - Attendance:

Added FS: 1000.36 stating that students may receive five excused days when absences are due to a parent/guardian leaving for active duty, on leave from active duty or returning from deployment.

Page 45 - Course Sequencing/Junior High School:

Indicated that junior high students can earn high school credits through FLVS, if appropriate.

Page 48 – Florida Virtual School: Added the following:

- FLVS is available to full-time students in K-5 or to full-time and/or part-time in virtual courses in 6-12:
- To receive a school diploma, student must obtain a minimum of 50% of required credits at the school site. Students who do not meet this criteria will receive a Clay County diploma and will not participate in graduation activities.

Page 51 – Graduation Options:

- Added points to remember for students choosing one of the three graduation options in order to better prepare them for this decision;
- Added clarification on the "Three-Year 18-Credit College Preparatory Program";
- Added clarification on the "Three-Year 18-Credit Career Preparatory Program".

Page 56 - Graduation Requirement

Changes for 9th graders entering in 2007-2008 to current school year.

Page 58 - Honor Roll:

Added the definition of "Honor Roll" status based on county criteria:

- "A" Honor Roll will consist of all "A's" on or above grade level;
- "A/B" Honor Roll will consist of all "A's" or "B's" on or above grade level;
- Unweighted grades are utilized for Honor Roll selection;
- Conduct grades do not count toward Honor Roll determination.

Page 58 - Interim Reports:

Added emphasis to the need to provide remedial strategies for students who are in jeopardy of failing at the interim period.

Page 60 - Added Section on "Physical Education":

Statement about Senate Bill 610 requiring each district to do the following:

- Provide one-on-one counseling to students regarding the benefits of Physical Education;
- Requiring the equivalent of one-class period per day of P.E> for at least one semester for students in grades 6-8;
- · Provide for a waiver option to students.

Page 64 - Promotion and Placement within the Junior High School Grades 7 and 8:

Listed F.S. 1003.4156 stating that students in grades 6-8 must pass the following in order to be promoted to grade 9:

- 3 courses in English
- · 3 courses in Mathematics
- 3 courses in Social Studies
- 3 courses in Science
- Complete a career course in 7th or 8th grade and complete the ePep.

Page 64 - Promotion and Placement in the High School:

- Emphasized F.S. 1008.25(6)(a) stating that students shall not be socially promoted;
- Defined grade designation as based on completing a full year in the previous grade;
- Emphasized that students are assigned to a cohort in 9th grade and will be advanced each year;
- Emphasized that "credit-status" determines eligibility for graduation and the importance of staying on track for this purpose.

Page 65 - Remediation:

Added information about Compass Learning being provided to the secondary schools for remediation purposes.

Added information about 11th graders being eligible for the CPT in order to determine eligibility for remediation classes prior to entering post-secondary schools.

Page 65 - Student Performance Standards Requirements:

Added information on eligibility of students receiving diploma if they have a concordant score and have failed the FCAT three times.

Page 68 - Added section - Transferring Student and Graduation:

Emphasizes the following:

- Transferring student in the 11th or 12th grade, if meeting all of the requirements from the transferring site, will not have to spend additional time in school in order to meet Clay County's requirements;
- Non-proficient English speakers should receive additional support;
- To receive a standard diploma, student must have 2.0 GPA, pass FCAT or have concordant scores after failed attempts.

Page 68 - Transfer Credit Policies and Guidelines:

Emphasized the following:

- · Definition of an official transcript;
- · Examples of unofficial transcripts;
- · Procedures for using the "Alternative Validation Procedure".

Exceptional Student Education Section:

Page 76: Clarify "...The Sunshine State Standards Access Points for Special Diploma went into effect for all students entering the 9th Grade during the 2007-2008 school year". Delete reference to pending review for Social Studies standards.

Page 80: Add note to (A)...that only accommodations approved by the Department of Education are permissible on standardized assessments.

Page 82: Insert Section B explaining Alternate Assessment for Students with Significant Cognitive Disabilities.

Page 83: Insert Section D noting that ESE students with significant cognitive disabilities in Grade K-2 are evaluated with a modified report card. Renumber remainder of section.

Adult Education Section

Page 86 - Mathematics:

Students must pass Algebra I, its equivalent or a higher math in order to meet the math requirements.

Page 87 - Science:

Added that Physical Science and Biology is highly recommended.

Page 87 - Practical Arts:

Courses in the Practical Arts may be accepted. Refer to the Practical Arts Course Guide.

Page 87 - Life Management Skills:

A ½ credit in LMS is no longer required; however, if a student has received a passing grade in this course it will be accepted.

Page 87 - Special Note:

Offers a listing of courses that can be substituted in order to fulfill elective requirements.
